Players

As a player for Washington AFC I will:

- 1. Wear WAFC match day clothing given to you at the beginning of the season.
- 2. On arrival shirts should be tucked in, socks pulled up, shins must be worn, no jewellery and hair to be tied back
- 3. Always do my best, even if the team is losing
- 4. Play fairly at all times, I will not cheat.
- 5. Respect the referee decision is final and I will not complain
- 6. Respect my fellow team mates, opposition team, referee, spectators and my coach
- 7. At the end of the match, shake hands with the opponents by lining up, whatever the result
- 8. Play safely, remembering it is only a game, and should be enjoyed

I understand if I do not follow the code any/ all of the following actions may be taken by my Club, County FA or The FA

- 1. Be required to apologise to my team mates, the other team, referee of coach
- 2. Receive a formal warning from the coach or the Club Committee
- 3. Be dropped or substituted
- 4. Be suspended from training
- 5. Be required to leave the Club

Parents/ Spectators

As a parent of the Club I will:

- 2. Never use offensive/ insulting/ abusive language or behaviour

- 5. Please remember that your coach is giving up their free time, so that your child can participate
- 6. Decisions of the coach must never be questioned
- 7. Must not approach the coach during, at half time with regards to substitutions
- 8. You must refrain from coaching on the sidelines. Your child is to be coached by your coach and will have been given specific roles/instructions. Your input, however, small may confuse your child and affect their performance
- 9. Never criticise a player for making a mistake-mistakes are part of learning
- 10. Support your child, their team and also the opponents
- 11. Please remember your child plays because he/ she enjoys the game and wants to develop. So the final result is not the be all and end all. At the end of the match congratulate your child.

I understand if I do not follow the code any/ all of the following actions may be taken by my Club, County FA, league or The FA

- 1. Issued with a verbal warning from a Club or league official
- 2. Required to meet with the Club, League or County Welfare Officer
- 3. Required to meet the Club Committee
- 4. Obliged to undertake an FA education course such as Soccer Parent
- 5. Request to leave the match venue by the Club
- 6. Requested by the Club not to attend future games
- 7. Required to leave the Club with my children(s)
